About our guest speaker

Manvendra Singh Gohil is the former Crown Prince of Rajpipla, an erstwhile princely State of Gujarat and the 39th direct descendant of the 650-year-old Gohil Dynasty. He is the first member of a royal family to openly come out as gay to the world.

He is the only Indian to be interviewed by Oprah Winfrey three times and has been featured on the show "Keeping up with the Kardashians". He is the Chairperson and Co-founder of Lakshya Trust dedicated towards the Empowerment of the LGBT community.

He is also the Brand Ambassador of AIDS Healthcare Foundation India Cares, the world's oldest and largest non-profit organization for HIV testing and treatment.



About our moderator

Carlos Idibouo – Vice President of Accessibility, Diversity and Inclusion

Originally from Côte d'Ivoire, Carlos has been living in Canada for the last 14 years and identifies as Queer feminist gender non-conforming.

Experienced projects consultant, Carlos successfully manages issues related to human rights, gender-based violence, sexual and gender diversity within the LGBTQI communities, women and children's rights, as well as some advocacy policies for a Global access of HIV treatment and prevention strategies.

Carlos focuses his current work on understanding the trajectory of Patriarchy and how Toxic masculinities manifest themselves within the African LGBTQI communities, and what could be the best strategic approaches to addressing them.

Carlos is a board member of several national and international organizations such as Dignity Network Canada, a Canadian network that aims to engage and support the Canadian Government in his leadership on issues related to LGBTQI Human rights and its Feminist International Assistance Policy, Board member of the MenEngage North America, an international movement that aims to educate boys and men on issues related to masculinities, women's rights, gender equality and Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights.

In 2016, Carlos co-founded the House of Culture for Human Diversity, a feminist-led organization based in Côte d'Ivoire: which mandate focuses on utilizing Cultures and Arts as a powerful tool to address issues related to Diversity and Inclusion within the LGBTQI communities and broadly.

"Racism and Oppression exist throughout the world and will continue to exist as long as skin color remains a determining factor as criterion of superiority and inferiority. On the other hand, by learning to uncover our unconscious bias, we can mitigate them and make more intentional and conscious choices."
